QUICK TIPS: STAYING SAFE

Don't give in to peer pressure, talk to a trusted person about your worries and always call 999 in an emergency!

TOPIC 4: COMPASS STARS

Compass stars is the name for our service that supports the children and young people that are affected by another person's drug and alcohol use. This could be someone within the family or outside of the family network. Another term used to describe this may be hidden harm.

What we offer:

Compass can help by providing support to that young person. We offer age appropriate information, 1:1 support, health promotion and whole family support where appropriate. We also listen to our young people, giving them a chance to talk about any issues they may have.

Hidden harm

Hidden harm can have an effect on an individual before birth, with those under 1 and those over 9 being the most heavily affected. A person can suffer harm through physical and emotional neglect, including exposure to harm. If these issues are not addressed, there is a risk of substance misuse, criminality and violence becoming normalized.

Covid-19
