# **Anti-Bullying Week 2022 toolkit**

Anti-Bullying Week takes place this year from 14th to 18th November. This year, the theme for the week is 'reach out' – encouraging everyone to come together and reach out to others to stop bullying.

In order to encourage pupils to reach out and unite against bullying, it's crucial that the school environment is safe and supportive for pupils.

If a child feels safe and supported at school, it makes it easier for them to ask for help if they need it, and creates a sense of community among pupils and staff.

In this toolkit, we're sharing resources for Anti-Bullying Week. There are resources for pupils, which will get them thinking about how to support one another, and resources for staff about how to create a safe school environment free of bullying.
